



Important Notice: Free School Meals

We can now confirm that that food packs will be distributed for students in receipt of free school meals on **Monday 30th March**.

In order to make collection easier for parents / carers this will take place between **1pm and 2pm** in two locations within the local community. Food packs can be collected from either:

- 1. In front of St Augustine's Parish House (close to Cardinal Newman College).**
- 2. In front of St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, Rigby Street.**

The food pack will include 5 days worth of nutritious breakfasts and lunches. Please do everything you can to take advantage of this opportunity.

Any parent /carers who are absolutely unable to collect food packs should email reception@ctk.lancs.sch.uk or leave an answer phone message on 01772 252072 and we will do everything we can to get food to you. **Please only do so if you or a representative cannot get to one of the collection points.**
