



Important Notice - Key Workers and Vulnerable Students

You will be aware that school will remain open from Monday 23rd March for the children of key workers and for those considered to be vulnerable.

If one parent is included in the list below and you wish your child to attend school please contact Janet Dockray on 01772 252072 before 3pm on 20th March.

Key Workers

At present the government's definition of key workers is as follows:

- Health and social care e.g. doctors, midwives, paramedics, social workers, care workers, other front line health and social care staff
- Education and child care e.g. nursery and teaching staff, social workers and specialist education professionals
- Public Services e.g. essential workers in the judicial system, religious staff, charity and workers delivering key frontline services, those responsible for managing the deceased, journalists and broadcasters providing public broadcasting services
- Local and national government
- Food and other necessary goods e.g. those involved in food production, sale and delivery, those essential to providing key goods such as hygienic and veterinary medicines
- Public services and national security e.g. police and support staff, Ministry of Defence workers, fire and rescue, National Crime Agency, border security, prison and probation staff
- Transport e.g. those involved in air, water and rail transport and freight transport
- Utilities, communication and financial services e.g. workers in banks, and building societies, oil, gas, electricity and water sectors, IT infrastructure sector and primary industry supplies sector, key staff in civil nuclear, chemicals and telecommunications, postal services and waste disposal sectors.

Vulnerable Students

Parents / Carers of vulnerable students should already have been contacted by a member of staff to discuss arrangements for the period of school closure. If you consider your child to be in a vulnerable category but have not been contacted, please contact your child's Achievement Coordinator to discuss the matter urgently.

Please note that any students who have previously been sent home to self-isolate must complete their 14 day isolation period before taking advantage of this initiative.
